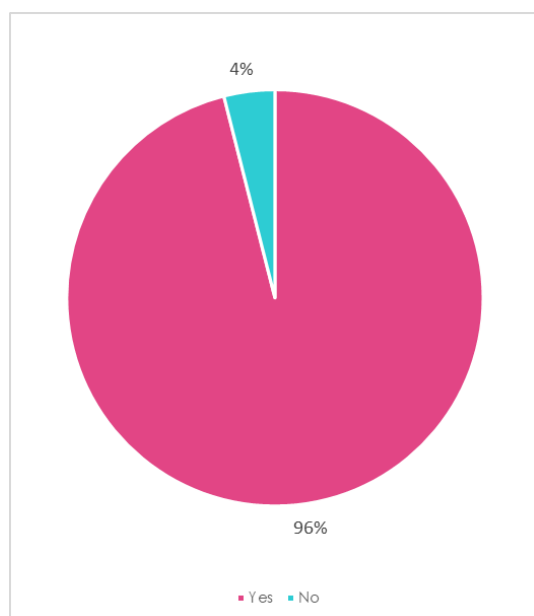

We received a total of 76 responses from pupils across our School, which gives an 93% response rate.

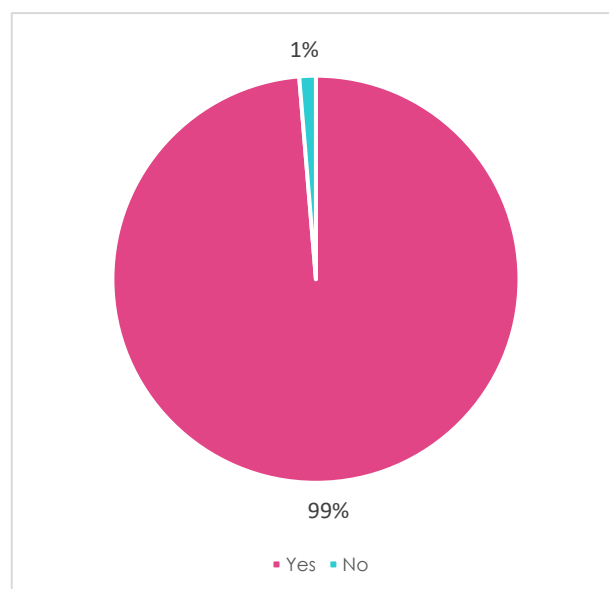
1. I am proud to attend my school



It is great to see so many children are proud to attend ASM. This high level of pride reflects the strong sense of community that define All Saints Marsh.

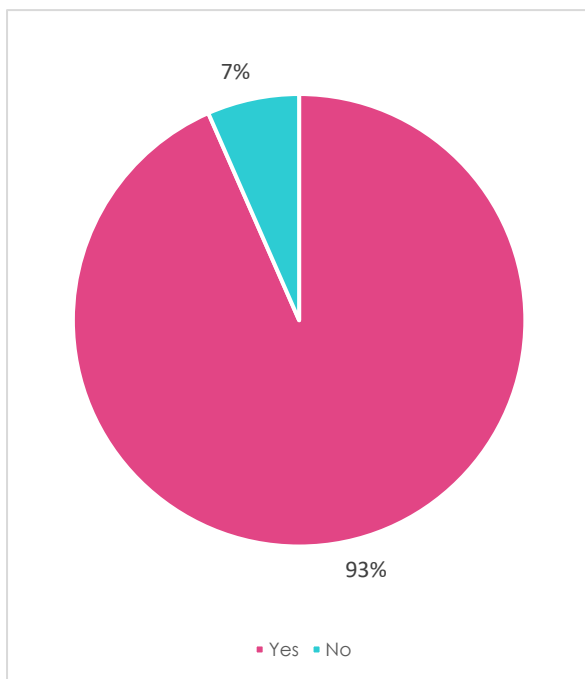

3. Do the school values help you to understand how to live together as a school



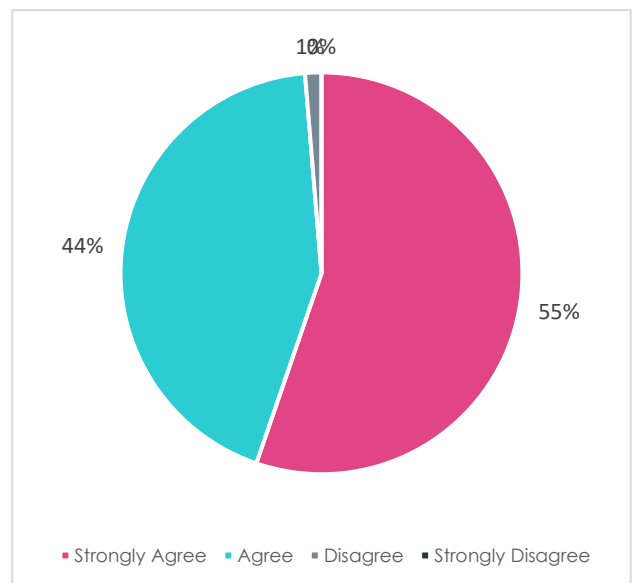
It's wonderful to see more children confidently talking about how our school values help us understand how we live together every day. Many have shared thoughtful reflections on how these values guide their actions and relationships.

"The values help me to understand how to behave and be part of the school family"

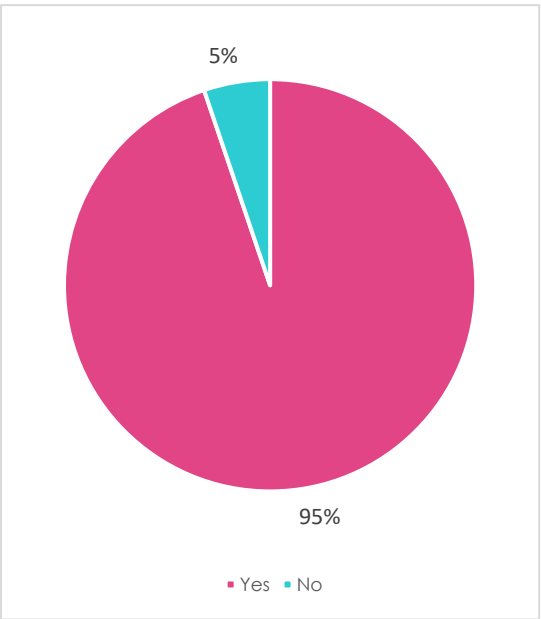
4. My teacher(s) knows me and understands how I learn

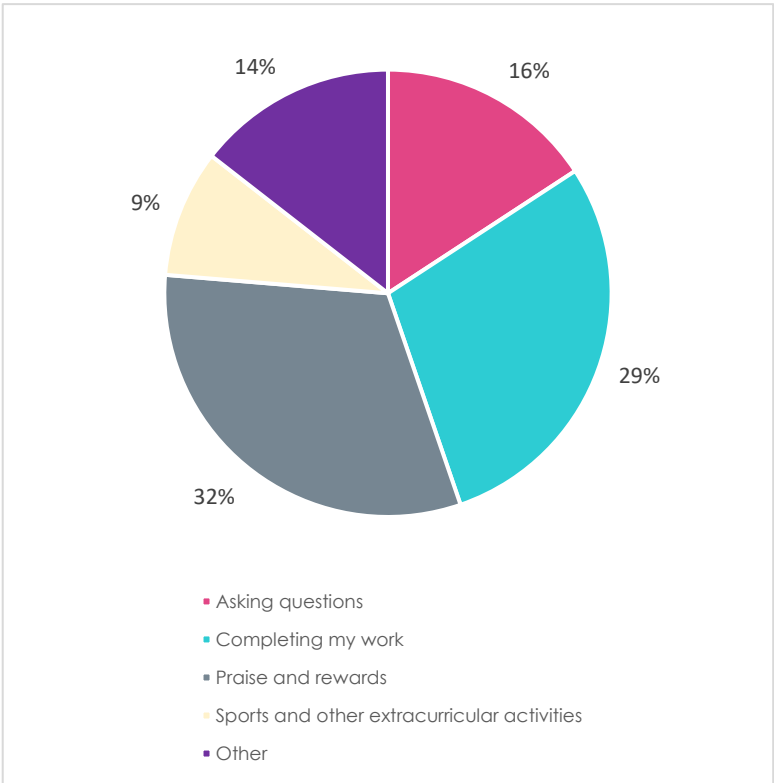


5. Does your teacher help you when you find things hard?

6. What motivates you to learn more?

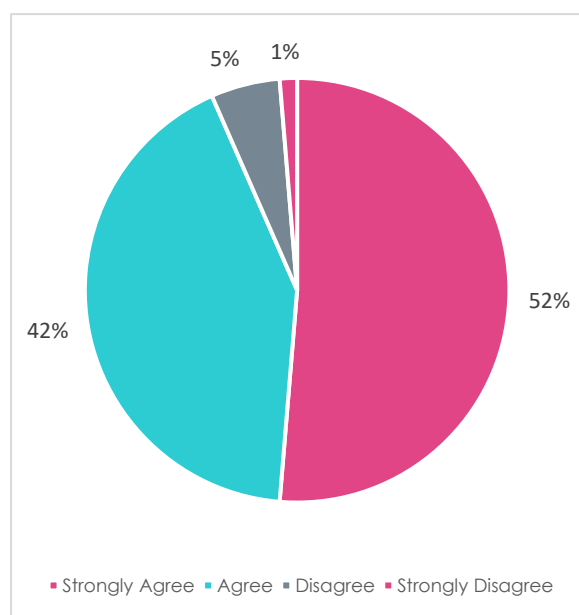

"More Art"

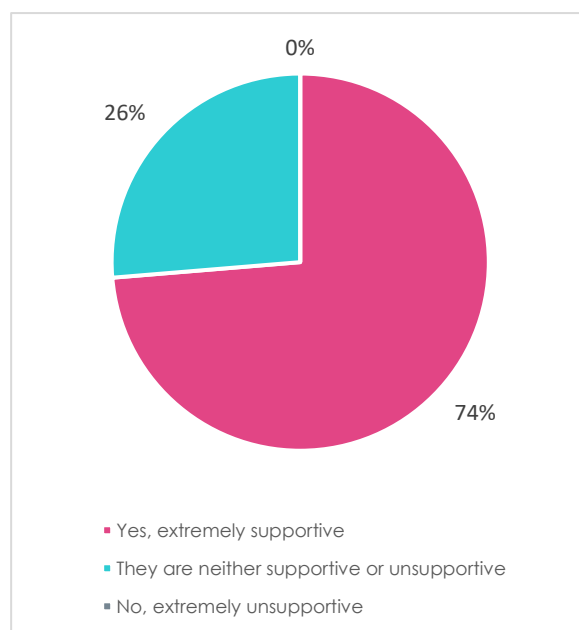

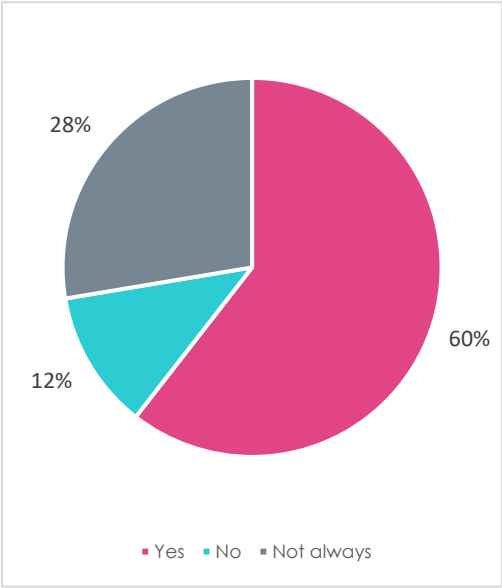
8. Do you have supportive classmates?

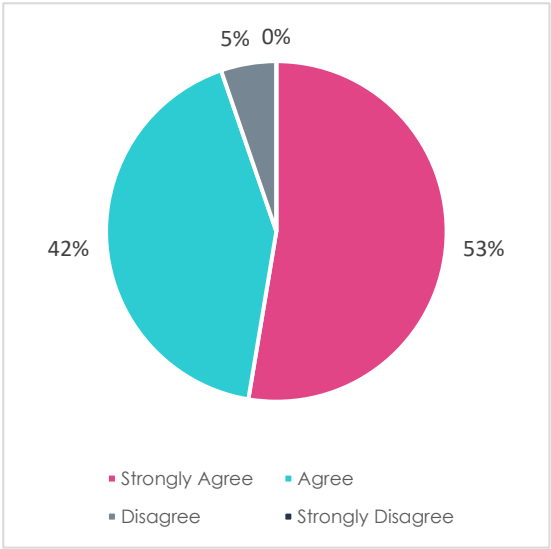
9. Do you think that the school provides you with enough sports / musical opportunities?

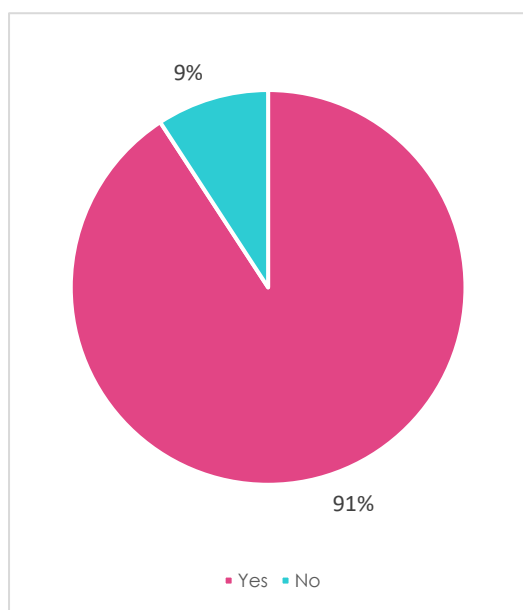
10. In my class there are clear expectations for behaviour and it's fair

Your school is part of a family of schools. What sort of things would you like to be able to do with other schools in our Trust?

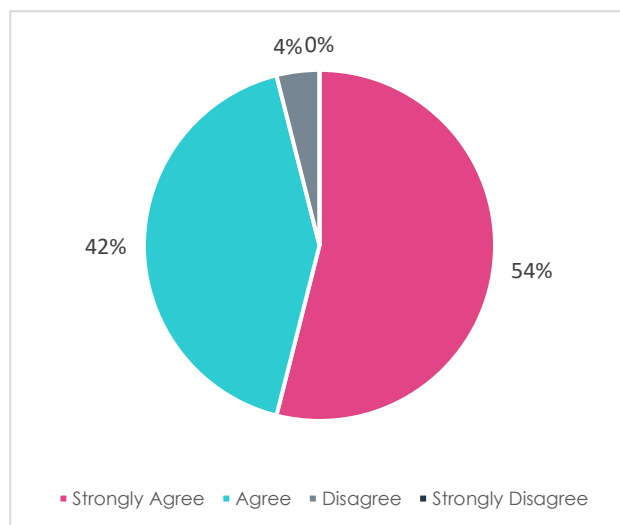
