School Trip to Plymouth Magistrates' Court – Thursday 5th March 2026

We are delighted to inform you that as part of the National Justice Museum Learning programme, our pupils have been invited to take part in an exciting educational experience at Plymouth Magistrates' Court. This visit will give students the unique opportunity to step inside a real working courtroom and participate in a mock trial.

During the day, pupils will take on roles such as judge, barristers, witnesses, clerk, usher, and jury members. They will even have the chance to dress up in wigs and gowns to enact a trial based on a real case. Wherever possible, legal professionals will also be present to answer questions in a Q&A session. Our court theme for the day will focus on cyberbullying, making this a fantastic opportunity for students to learn about the justice system in a practical and engaging way.

Travel and Timings:

We will travel by coach, leaving school at 8:45am and returning by 3:00pm. The PTFA has kindly agreed to fund the cost of transport.
