Dear Parents and Carers.

The highlight of the last few days was undoubtedly the school trip to Paignton Zoo, where we saw plenty of exciting and amazing animals - and the children of Courtenay Class behaved themselves extremely impressively (to the compliments of many zoo staff and visitors).

In Maths, we have been learning more about decimals, and in particular the partitioning, rounding, comparing and ordering of decimals, which the children have made great progress with.

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Rohan is Star of the Week for always setting a great example with his 'role model' behaviour and learning around the school.
Well done!

In Science, we have been studying how the Sun can be dangerous for our eyes and skin – and we have experimented with UV beads to test out what would happen when these are exposed to UV light. Also, we studied how the length of shadows changes as the Sun moves around the sky during the course of a school day.

In PE, we have been further developing our cricket skills; in RE, we have looked at how different religious and non-religious people try to make the World a better place; and in Music, we have been working with a trained musician to improve our singing and rhythm skills.
